Re: New Information, Revisions and Reminders of Previously Released DHS COVID-19

Policies and Guidance

This Memorandum includes new and updated information about:

- Required reporting by placement providers about children and youth who have been exposed to COVID-19.
- Who is required to be notified by placement providers when children and youth test positive for COVID-19.
- o The names of the DHS Pandemic Coordinator and Liaisons.

Reporting Exposure of Children and Youth to COVID-19 by Staff and Others

The original notification procedures were provided in the following protocols issued November 12, 2020:

- "When Children and Youth Committed to DHS are Exposed to, Symptomatic of, Awaiting Test Results for, or Test Positive for COVID-19".
- "When DHS, CUA or Provider Agencies Expose Children and Youth in Care or Receiving In-Home Services to COVID-19".

Consistent with information sent by the DHS Commissioner on November 18, 2020 (Clarification about COVID-19 email), notification requirements have been revised for placement providers completing and submitting COVID-19 related Home and Community Services Information System (HCSIS) reports within 24 hours of discovery on all children and youth in the care of the Provider who are exposed to, symptomatic of, awaiting test results for, or test positive for the virus.

The new requirements are:

- Placement providers are required to complete and submit HCSIS reports within 24 hours of discovery if a child or youth in their care <u>tests positive for COVID-19</u>. HCSIS reports are no longer required for children who are exposed to, symptomatic of, or awaiting test results for COVID-19.
- All COVID-19 <u>exposures</u> of children and youth by staff or others should be <u>tracked internally</u> by the provider.



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In addition, consistent with information sent by the DHS Commissioner on November 18, 2020:

- Within 2 hours of discovery, notifications about children and youth that have been <u>tested or are</u> <u>awaiting test results</u>, need to be sent to the following email boxes:
 - For executive leadership.
 - DHSCOVID@phila.gov
 - DHS Nurse Unit.
 - o Children and youth in placement (PlacementNurse@phila.gov).
 - Children and youth receiving in-home services (<u>AskANurse@phila.gov</u>).

All other requirements about notifications in the protocols "When Children and Youth Committed to DHS are Exposed to, Symptomatic of, Awaiting Test Results for, or Test Positive for COVID-19" and "When Children and Youth Committed to DHS are Exposed to, Symptomatic of, Awaiting Test Results for, or Test Positive for COVID-19" remain in effect.

We also urge you to follow ongoing developments in federal, state, and city COVID-19 related public health requirements and guidance.
